Ursula Anne⁶, died 21 Aug. 1844, aged 78, as widow resided in Campbell County, married, 6 April 1781 in Mecklenburg County, Francis Otway⁷ Byrd, born 8 May 1756, died 2 Sept. 1800, son of 65. William⁶ Byrd III (see ST. LEGER), midshipman in the British navy until he resigned, 1775, lieutenant colonel of 3rd Virginia Light Dragoons in Revolutionary War, sheriff of Charles City County, 1786-87, clerk of that county, 1790-97, collector of the port of Norfolk, 1804,²³⁴ 177. William⁶, born 15 Aug. 1775, Mecklenburg County, died 21 June 1825, Richmond,²³⁵ studied law at College of William and Mary, 1790-94, member of the House of Delegates from Mecklenburg County, 1797-98, 1800-02, and of the Senate, 1802-06,²³⁶ moved to Richmond where he was a member of the Privy Council until 1811, then clerk of the House of Delegates, 1811-25,²³⁷ and reporter for the Virginia Court of Appeals, married, 27 Feb. 1802,²³⁸ Sarah⁷ Radford, born 1785, died 1864, daughter of William Radford and 431. Rebecca⁶ Winston (see JORDAN, Thomas).

80. Capt. THEODORICK⁵ MUNFORD (Anna⁴ Bland, Richard³, Theodorick², John¹), born 21 Feb. 1741/2,²³⁹ died Oct. 1772 at Col. John Banister's in Dinwiddie County.²⁴⁰ He was a student at the grammar school of the College of William and Mary, 1753-54. He married ____.

will proved 21 Dec. 1807.²⁴⁵ He was licensed for Virginia, 25 Feb. 1761, and was minister of Dale Parish, Chesterfield County, 1773-75, chairman of the Committee of Safety of Chesterfield County, minister of St. Patrick's Parish, Prince Edward County, 1776-79, and later organized a dissenting body and then joined the Presbyterian Church and was trustee of Hampden-Sydney College, 1783.²⁴⁶
