Ursula Anne<sup>6</sup>, died 21 Aug. 1844, aged 78, as widow resided in Campbell County, married, 6 April 1781 in Mecklenburg County, Francis Otway<sup>7</sup> Byrd, born 8 May 1756, died 2 Sept. 1800, son of 65. *William*<sup>6</sup> *Byrd* III (see ST. LEGER), midshipman in the British navy until he resigned, 1775, lieutenant colonel of 3rd Virginia Light Dragoons in Revolutionary War, sheriff of Charles City County, 1786-87, clerk of that county, 1790-97, collector of the port of Norfolk, 1804;<sup>234</sup> 177. William<sup>6</sup>, born 15 Aug. 1775, Mecklenburg County, died 21 June 1825, Richmond,<sup>235</sup> studied law at College of William and Mary, 1790-94, member of the House of Delegates from Mecklenburg County, 1797-98, 1800-02, and of the Senate, 1802-06,<sup>236</sup> moved to Richmond where he was a member of the Privy Council until 1811, then clerk of the House of Delegates, 1811-25,<sup>237</sup> and reporter for the Virginia Court of Appeals, married, 27 Feb. 1802,<sup>238</sup> Sarah<sup>7</sup> Radford, born 1785, died 1864, daughter of William Radford and 431. *Rebecca*<sup>6</sup> *Winston* (see JORDAN, Thomas).
