John Carter, b. ca 1613 Christ Church Parish, Newgate St., London; d. 10 Jan 1669/70 Corotoman Plantation; he was probably buried in the chancel of the first Christ Church, Lancaster Co.; his tombstone now lies in the n. side of the chancel in the current Christ Church; John built the original church; he came to

Virginia in 1635 at age 22 on the ship Safety (said to have come with his bro. Thomas Carter); he first settled in Upper Norfolk Co. which later became Nansemond Co.; he returned to England on business several time, served in the House of Burgesses for Upper Norfolk Co. 1642/2 & 1642/3, for Nansemond Co. 1649 & for Lancaster Co. 1654/5, 1657/8, 1658/9 & 1659/60; between 1642 & 1665 he patented 6,160 ac. in Lancaster Co. and established Corotoman Plantation on the Rappahannock River between Carter's Creek & Corotoman River; he was a Justice of Lancaster Co. 1653-9, Vestryman of Christ Church Parish, etc.; 20 Sep 1661 Col. John Carter patented 450 ac. on the easternmost branch of Corotoman River which was later given to William Cooke (LOP 5.309); m/l ca 1637 London Jane Glyn; d. ca 1652; d/o Morgan Glyn of Middlesex, England; m/2 ca 1655 Eleanor Eltonhead; d. ca 1656; d/o William Eltonhead & widow of Capt. Tombstone of Betty Carter, Christ Church: To the memory of Betty Carter, second wife of Robert Carter, Esq. Youngest daughter of Sir Thomas Langdon and Mary his wife of Grednal, in the country of Hereford, England, the ancient seat of the family and place of her nativity. She bore her husband 10 children, five sons and five daughters, three of whom, Sarah, Betty and Ludlowe, died before her and are buried near here. She was a person of great and exemplary piety and charity in every relation in which she stood, whether considered as a Christian, a wife, a mother, a mistress, a neighbor, or a friend, her conduct was equally by few, excelled by none. He was Speaker of the House of Burgesses, and Treasurer under the most serene Princes William, Anne, George I and II. Elected by the House its Speaker six years, and Governor of the Colony for more than a year, he upheld equally the regal dignity and the public freedom. Possessed of ample wealth, blamelessly acquired, he built and endowed.

at his own expense, this sacred edifice - a signal monument of his piety toward God. He furnished it richly. Entertaining his friends kindly, he was neither a prodigal nor a parsimonious host. His first wife was Judith, daughter of John Armistead. Esq.; his second Betty, a descendant of the noble family of Landons. By these wives he had many children, on whose education he expended large sums of money. At length, full of honours and of years, when he had performed all the duties of an exemplary life, he departed from this world on the 4th day of August, in the 69th year of his age.
