Page 207Noncumulative will of Benjamin Hawkins

Date of will - May 19, 1777

Date probated - May 19, 1777

Benjamin Hawkins, blacksmith, who departed this life on Fryday the second day of May (1777) etc. declared in the presence of Henry Anderson, Edward Borum, and Joel Hundley all of Amelia County, planters, as follows:

Wife, Anne Hawkins, and his children to share equally in his estate.

Son-in-law, Owen Smith, to have the land over the road, he to preserve the shop for the use of said Hawkins' sons.

Page 207Will of James Read

Date of will - October 10, 1777

Date probated - August Court, 1778.

Son, Joseph, 100 acres southwest of place I live on, adjoins John Smith.

Son, Robert, five shillings.

"My well-beloved —— (son?) Moses, I give the place I live on."

"My son Moses my sole executor."

Witnesses: John Porter, James Graham, James Memgon.

Date of will - March 6, 1776

Date of will - January 11, 1781

Joel Jackson, Magdilene Jackson and James Jackson, my four children."
