the balance of the money arising from the sale of said land to be equally divided amongst my three Sisters viz Elizabeth Wilson, Ann Wilson and Polly Wilson, as to the movable property I possess according to my Father's last Will and Testament, I will that the same be distributed as follows viz my dear girl Mary to be married to my dear Henry Wilson daughter to David Wilson of the County of Augusta and State of Virginia the balance of my Bequest to my dear woman Eliza to my Brother James Page of the County of Augusta and State of Virginia I will and bequeath to my dear girl Mary the sum of one hundred dollars and to my dear girl Eliza the sum of one hundred dollars and to my dear girl Polly the sum of one hundred dollars and the remainder of my Estate I will and bequeath to my dear girl Mary to be married to my dear Henry Wilson of the County of Augusta and State of Virginia

In the Name of God Amen, I Agness Poage of the County of Augusta and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory and apprehension of my approaching dissolution do make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament in manner following Viz: First after having resigned my soul to God. I will that my body be decently entered and that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate. I also will and ordain that the land bequeathed to be my by my Father Thos. Poage deceased be sold so soon as my Executors shall think proper and two hundred pounds of the money arising from the sale thereof be for the use and benefit of Elizabeth and Thomas Poage infants the Children of my Brother Robert Poage of Fayette County Kentucky to be under the particular direction of my Brother Elijah Poage of the County and State aforesaid the balance of the money arising from the sale of sd Land to be equally divided amongst my three Sisters Viz Elizabeth Wilson, Ann Wood, and Polly Wilson, as to the movable property I possess by virtue of my Father's last Will and Testament, I will that it be distributed as follows Viz my negro girl Kitty I bequeath to my Niece Nancy Wilson daughter to Rev'd. Wilm. — Wilson I will and Bequeath my Negro woman Sall to my Brother John Poage of Rockbridge County. Item, I will and bequeath my little negro girl Emmy to my Brother Elijah Poage of Kentucky. The remainder of my property not heretofore mentioned I do order to be sold and the money arising from

the sale of sd. property to be equally divided amongst my four Brothers Likewise my Money now in the hands of my Brother William to be equally divided amongst my four Brothers -- I appoint my two Brother John Poage & William Poage Executors of this my last will and testament March 26th, 1804.

At a Court held for Augusta County, June the 25th, 1804. This last Will and Testament of Agness Poage dec'd. was proved by the oaths of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of John Poage and William Poage the Executors therein named who made oath oath according to law, and together with George Crawford their Security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of eight thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form.
