## JOHN WILSON REYNOLDS

John Wilson Reynolds died Saturday evening, after reaching advanced age.

The funeral is tomorrow

The deceased was nearly ninety-one years old---had lived in Illinois since 1836

Death has removed another one of the pioneers of Warren County. After nearly reaching the exceptional age of ninety-one years of age, John Wilson Reynolds passed away Saturday evening at 7:45 at the home of his son J.W. Reynolds Jr., who resides seven miles north of the city. Mr. Reynolds had been in failing health for a number of years, due to his extreme age. For the past ten days, however his condition was much worse and the end was not unexpected. Death was due merely to the infirmities incident to old age.

### PERSONAL SKETCH

The deceased was born August 17, 1818, at Statesville, North Carolina, being the son of John G. and Jane (Millegan) Reynolds, who were of Scotch decent. As early as 1829 Mr. Reynolds moved with his family to Indiana and came to Illinois in Oct. 1836, when this section was still a wild state. He settled on a farm in Sugar Tree Grove neighborhood where he resided until six years ago, after which time he made his home with his son John W. Reynolds Jr.

On September 1, 1846, he was united in marriage to Miss Jane Campbell, the ceremony taking place in Hale township. Mrs. Reynolds was born in Carroll County, Ohio, June 23, 1826. Ten children blessed the union, of whom the following are living: Beveridge, of Beklemen, Neb; William, of Humeston, Iowa; John W., north of this city; Mrs. Frank P. Kilgore Ainsworth, Iowa; Mrs. Sarah Seldon, Kirkwood; Ritchie, of Carrollton, Ill; Morrow of Colorado. Three children have passed away, George W., Martha, and Walker. Mrs. Reynolds died about nine years ago.

Mr. Reynolds was a fine type of manhood. For years he was a faithful member of the United Presbyterian church. He lived his religion and during his long and useful life made a large circle of friends who will learn of his demise with much regret. Politically he was a Republican. He served his township as School Director and was always interested in all that made for the bettering of humanity.
