State of Ohio } On this [blank] day of March in the year One thousand eight hundred and Seneca County } fifty two Personally appeared David S. Reynolds a resident of Seneca County in the State of Ohio being of lawful age and after being sworn according to law declares that he is the lawful heir of Thomas Runnells, who enlisted in the Virginia Continental line for during the war of the Revolution. deponent further states, that he has no remembrance of the names of his Company or field officers, or No. of his Regiment, and that he is dependant on the War department for instructions relitive to said servis; he further atests that the said Thomas Runnells was killed in battle.

Sir, About one year ago, I made application for a pension for the service of my Grandfather Thomas Reynolds who was a soldier of the Revolution and was killed at the battle of Yorktown [Siege of Yorktown VA, 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781], after serving in the U. S. Army two years and six months (in the Virginia Continental line) he had enlisted for during the War. My papers are on file – and I would be glad to hear what has been done with my application. I am the only son of John Reynolds dec'd who died in Virginia, and said John Reynolds was the last surviving son and heir of said Thomas Reynolds for whose services I am now trying to ger a pension.
