This last will and Testament of Sam<sup>l</sup> Deane dec<sup>d</sup> was presented in Court to the County Clerks named and sworn by the oath of William Taylor and Scammell Edwards two of the subscribing witnesses thereof and ordered to be recorded.

In the Name of God amen, I Nathaniel Swings follow Aligned in the latter words of both Court in the State of Virginia making over then appoint this to be my last will and Testament Now I give and bequeath to my wife Dinah Swings all my plantations that I now live on to be at her disposal as long as she lives I also bequeath her all my moveable property land and also to be at her disposal as long

as she lives and to give to whom she pleases at her death I now I give and bequeath to my wife Dinah Swings one hundred and two acres of land to be legally run off of the upper end of the said tract I now live on joining the bottom (now acre of the same) for the public use in buying yards after the death of me and my wife this divided acre of land I bequeath to my wife to be at her disposal to give to whom she pleases at her death Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Swings the remaining part of the aforesaid tract of land to her and her heirs forever after the death of me and my wife Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Dinah Swings five acres of land being a third part of a tract known by the name of the Bull's place to be run off of the South west end by a straight line to her and her heirs forever Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Maryburg to her and her heirs forever five acres of land of the East end of the said tract joining to that of my daughter Dinah Swings Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Annabell Swings three hundred pounds worth of property to be paid by my executor to her and her heirs Now I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Swings fifteen pounds worth of property to her and her heirs to be paid by my executor Now I give and bequeath to my son John Swings four shillings to be paid by my executor Now I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Swings four shillings to be paid by my executor Now I give and bequeath to my son Johna Swings four shillings to be paid by my executor Now I give and bequeath to my son Mary Swings four shillings to be paid by my executor Now I give and
