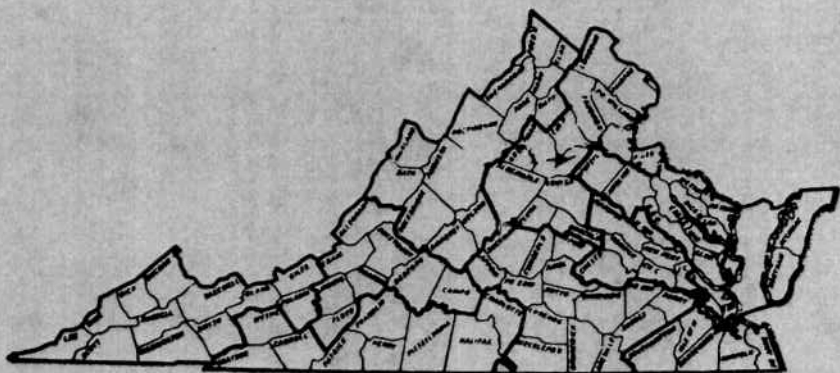

His administrator still holds considerable estate in slaves in consequence of their having been mortgaged before the war to secure the payment of large foreign debts. They still remain subject to these claims, to a much greater amount than their full alue.

[P. 108] Claudius P. Cary. £1.14.-, account, Manchester Store.

Samuel Duval. £2.7.3, Manchester Store. The elder Samuel Duval died about 1784 leaving property much more than sufficient to answer all just claims. His son Laibourne is executor. Samuel the Younger now lives in Franklin County and is unable to pay his debts; he came so prior to 1783 by losses of property in 1780 and 1781.

George Donald. £5.18.2½, open account, Manchester Store. He was never able to have paid it.

[Pp. 108-09] Turner Southall. £6.9.-, account, Manchester Store. He died many years past; his executor, his son Stephen, a man of great strictness and attention to anything he undertook, died during the spring of 1799, intestate. Turner Southall died possessed of considerable estate, much more than sufficient to have paid all just claims against him.

[P. 109] Robert Brown. £12.8.2, open account, Petersburg Store.

George Muter. £4.13.5, open account, Manchester Store; £21.2.3½, open account, Richmond Store. He is very able; one of the judges of the Court of Appeals in Kentucky and lives in Woodford County.

Robert Burton. £3.0.5½, open account, Charlotte Store.

Smith Blakey. £14.16.2½, bond, 15 Nov. 1775, Richmond Store. He says he has paid John Barret, except eight years' war interest.

Richard Crouch. £5.12.1, bond Sept. 1773, Richmond Store. This debt has long since been paid off.

[Pp. 109-10] Barbara Dunn. £4.0.0½, due by note, Richmond Store. Was at all times unable to pay.

[P. 110] Wm. Henderson. £8.12.7½, account, 17 Jan. 1775, Richmond Store. Was at all times unable to pay.

Hogg & Rowland. £23.6.11½, bond, 1 Sept. 1775, Richmond Store. They were never able to pay.

George Shearer. £15.0.7 3/4, signed account, Richmond Store. This debt has been paid. Saml. Shearer is administrator and the estate, though small, is sufficient to answer just demands.

Drury Hodges. £47.1.6½, account, Amherst Store. Always unable to pay.

Ninian Minzies. £17.18.2, Amherst Store. He never became a citizen of Virginia but adhered to the British cause and died a subject of the King of Great Britain.

[Pp. 110-11] Abraham Perkins. 5 sh. 3 d., account, Amherst Store. This sum is too inconsiderable to be claimed and is withdrawn.

[P. 111] Thomas Reid. 8/9, account, Amherst Store. He was a Scotchman, commonly called a Tory. He left the country about the commencement of the American Revolution through principle, being attached to the British government. He died shortly after, a subject of the King of Great Britain.

Julius Allen. £89.7.-, signed account, 13 Dec. 1776, Richmond Store. Suit was brought in the District Court at Richmond against Julius Allen the Younger and Miles Selden, executors. The defence was non assumpsit and the Act of limitation. The jury found for the plaintiff £150.15.4 damages. There are assets.

Richard Adams. £2.11.8½, account, Sept. 1775, Richmond Store. He died about Aug. 1800 leaving estate to the value of at least £20,000. His son John qualified as administrator.

[Pp. 111-12] Joseph Brown. £19.8.7½, bond, 5 May 1775, Richmond Store. This debt, except war interest, is paid.

[P. 112] Martin Burton. £28.8.7½, account, May 1775, Richmond Store.

Izard Bacon. £11.0.9 3/4, signed settlement in the day book, Richmond Store. This debt, except war interest, £8.5.-, is paid. The debtor lives in Henrico and is now amply able.

William F. Burton. £13.7.9, bond, 1 Feb. 1775, Richmond Store.

✓ Giles Carter. 19/3 3/4, account, Sept. 1776, Richmond Store. This debt, being too inconsiderable to claim, is withdrawn.

Wm. Duval. £19.1.6 3/4, bond, 1 Sept. 1775, Richmond Store. This debt, except war interest, has been paid. He is amply able to pay.

Saml. Duval Senr. £14.15.7, account, Richmond Store. He died about 1784 leaving sufficient estate to pay all debts which are just. His son Claibourn, who lives in Kentucky, is executor.

[Pp. 112-13] John Ford. £2.14.10 3/4, signed account, Richmond Store. In Oct. 1797 final payment made.

[P. 113] Thomas Fleming. £4.6.2½, bond, 1 Sept. 1774, Richmond Store. He died about 1777, able to pay all his just debts. His brother William qualified as his executor in Goochland County 21 July 1777. He did not give security nor has the estate been appraised, the will
